

## RUBISSOW ESTATE – Mt. Veeder – AT A GLANCE:

Rubissow Vineyard - a former grassy-ridged 1800s homestead - was purchased in 1983 and planted to vines by the family partnership of George Rubissow and his children, Ariel & Peter Rubissow. From the start, famed winemaker/consultant **André Tchelistcheff** was retained to work closely with the Rubissows in the meticulous planning and development of the site. Together, their singular goal focused on producing world-class Bordeaux-style red & white wines under the Rubissow~Sargent label.



After several successful decades in the market, in 2004 Peter & Ariel dissolved Rubissow~Sargent and founded **Rubissow**, with new winemaker **Timothy Milos** at the helm. Their vision was to respect and improve upon the decades of experience and farming wisdom gained in years prior, and to move ahead with modernity and elegance. Today Rubissow wines are enjoyed around the world by wine collectors and enthusiasts who value the estate's commitment to authentic terroir expression and pure, unfiltered deliciousness.



**Property:** • 45 acres (26.5 acres native oak & redwood forest / 18.5 acres vines)

**Vineyards:**

- 18.5 acres first planted in 1983.
- 16.7 acres currently planted. 1.8 acres fallow.
- Vineyard originally planted on AXR-1 in 1983.
- Replanted in 1994 on Phyloxera resistant roots.
- All vines are cordon trained to vertical trellis system.
- Original vineyard footprint remains.
- Meticulous vine care and fruit thinning to ensure maximum expression



**Individual Vines:** 18,799 - Hillsides on 3.5 ft x 12 ft. spacing.  
- Flatlands on 4 ft x 7 ft spacing.

**Varietals:**

- 55.08% Cabernet Sauvignon = 11,326 vines / 10.19 acres
- 15.51% Merlot = 3730 vines / 2.87 acres
- 11.56% Cabernet Franc = 2477 vines / 2.14 acres
- 9.72% Fallow = 2400 vines removed / 1.8 acres
- 4.97% Malbec = 482 plants / 0.92 acres
- 1.67% Syrah = 534 vines / 0.31 acres
- 1.49% Petit Verdot = 526 vines / 0.27 acre

**Annual Yield:** 25-35 tons – Yields range from 0.75 Tons to 2.5 Tons per acre.
